Teaching load entails 27 hours total for the academic year; summer optional. Faculty on Assistant Professor tenure track receive reassigned time to pursue scholarship. Teach introductory and elective courses in Education and Psychology. Participate in Departmental and College activities including committees, course and program assessment, curriculum development and preparation of grants. Work with Queensborough CC and Queens College faculty to meet the needs of students in the Dual-Joint A.A./B.A. Degree Program in Childhood Education. Provide academic support and advisement for students. For faculty in Assistant Professor rank, continued scholarly activities are required for tenure and promotion. Some evening or weekend teaching may be required. Position to start in Fall 2018.

The Department of Social Sciences encompasses eight disciplines (Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Economics, Education, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology) and has 33 full-time faculty.
